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The next item on the agenda was County Commissioner reports and comments. Commissioner Walker commented on news regarding the government doing more with less. He noted that the county needs to learn from the success of others and create partnerships with other entities.

Commissioner Wonnacott indicated that she read in the Casper Star Tribune that the Wyoming Transportation Commission awarded six highway projects. She explained that variable speed limit signs will be installed along Interstate 80 between the Green River tunnels and Rock Springs. She further noted that thirty-two LED signs will be installed along the highway to keep traffic moving safely.

Chairman Dellai-Boese expressed her appreciation to County Treasurer Robb Slaughter, County Clerk Dale Davis and County Assessor Dave Rauzi for educating the commission on how the tax assessment and mill levies are processed.

CEO Derek Brown commented on overcoming legal barriers and legislative challenges which would assist in implementing pilot projects.

Next, Chairman Dellai-Boese opened County Resident concerns and no comments were made.

The next item on the agenda was CEO reports. CEO Derek Brown spoke of the employee manual progress. He noted that he is awaiting further comments from the elected officials in order to proceed.

Mr. Brown stated that the orientation process manual for the commission and elected officials is forty percent complete. He noted that a staff orientation manual is also in progress.

Mr. Brown spoke that the performance management infrastructure is fifty percent complete. He explained that the project is to compile strategic and department goals. Mr. Brown noted that an individual pilot testing will be completed which will pull the performance project together.

Next, Mr. Brown spoke of civic participation. He noted that training will assist with providing an outward and pro-active approach to achieve participation from the county.

Mr. Brown noted that the commission will receive three new policies for review which will include vehicle use, electronic communications, and travel policies.

Lastly, Mr. Brown expressed that two elected officials have signed the conflict of interest statement.

Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that recruitment for volunteer boards be done. She further noted that the appointment of board members must be completed during the next board meeting. Commissioner Walker and Commissioner Wonnacott both expressed that they will follow up with their respective contacts at the Sweetwater County School Districts and the Chambers of Commerce.

Chairman Dellai-Boese announced that Young at Heart Senior Center Director Jeanine Cox will be the new chairman for the District Board of Health.

Chairman Dellai-Boese recognized Wyoming State Senator John Hastert and Wyoming State Representative Bernadine Craft for their efforts on keeping a bill regarding Community Health alive. She

requested that the commission send a letter of recognition and appreciation to Senator Hastert and Representative Craft.

Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that the commission by-laws and protocol be presented during the next administrative meeting.

Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that she and Mr. Brown schedule a meeting with the Golden Hour Senior Center in Green River.

Mr. Brown invited residents to meet with him at any time.

The next order of business was Department Head reports. Controller Jason McCormick encouraged the commission to obtain a detailed report from County Treasurer Robb Slaughter regarding the general fund. Chairman Dellai-Boese requested to discuss the resolution regarding the general fund during the next administrative meeting.

Mr. McCormick spoke of the transformation of accounting standards for governmental entities. Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that Mr. McCormick schedule a special meeting with McGee, Hearne & Paiz, LLP.

Human Resources Manager Garry McLean presented a contract for time and attendance. He expressed the importance of executing the contract to purchase the licensing and software for the time and attendance system. Commissioner Wonnacott moved to approve the contract with Execu/time and authorize you, as Chair, to sign. Commissioner Walker seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The next order of business was grants. Grants Manager Krisena Marchal requested approval of the Addendum to the OJDP Non-Participating Formula Grant. Commissioner Wonnacott moved to approve and have the chairperson sign the Addendum to the OJDP Non-Participating Formula Grant. Commissioner Walker seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Commissioner Wonnacott expressed that alternatives could be utilized and, due to the budget, requested to withdraw from the organization. A discussion ensued regarding the benefits that membership provides to Sweetwater County. Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that Community Development, Engineering and Grants form a committee to provide recommendations to the board to address socio-economics that assist Sweetwater County. Chairman Dellai-Boese requested that a revised public notice be sent for the June 2, 2010 special meeting to add a discussion with various coalitions. Commissioner Wonnacott moved to approve the letter notifying the EMC2 coalition of our desire to withdraw. Commissioner Walker seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The next order of business was new business. Green River Parks and Recreation Director Walt Bratton, Green River Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Janet Hartford, Sweetwater County Recreation Board Executive Director & Board President Carl Morck, and Sweetwater Mountain Bike Association representative Tom MacIntosh were in attendance. Ms. Hartford requested that the Board of Commissioners declare June 5, 2010 as Sweetwater County Mountain Bike Day. Commissioner Walker read the following proclamation.

Mr. Brown explained that the code of ethics and communication policies will be implemented for the department heads only.

Mr. Brown noted that the elected officials requested more time to review the personnel manual.

Mr. Brown spoke that the workforce redeployment and comparisons have been completed and a presentation will follow within the next two weeks.

Mr. Brown noted that the orientation manual for the commissioners and elected officials is in progress. Commissioner Wonnacott requested to incorporate information from GASB regarding elected official responsibilities and understanding of the process.

Lastly, Mr. Brown spoke that three communications policies are being implemented with intent to submit for distribution within a week.

Commissioner Walker set aside time for press questions. Rocket Miner Staff Writer Paul Murray and Green River Star Staff Writer Nicole Malicoat requested clarity on issues from the meeting.

Commissioner Walker asked for a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Wonnacott moved to adjourn. Commissioner Walker seconded the motion and the motion carried.

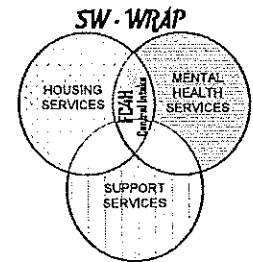

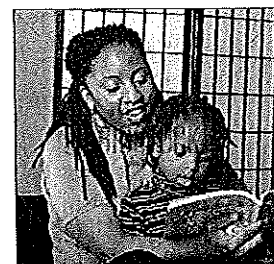

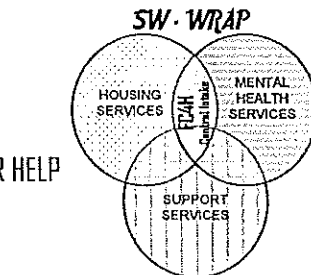

### Support

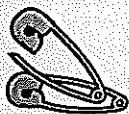
that offers a personal, unique process of changing one's attitudes, values, feelings, goals, skills and/or roles.

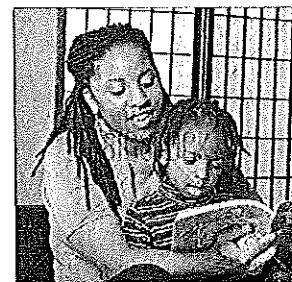
The Personal Essentials Pantry or PEP, begins in July of 2010, with the mission of helping those living in poverty deal with the gaps that food stamps & related social service programs do not address: the products of personal and household hygiene. They're not very glamorous; none of us are waiting with bated breath for the new fall fashions in toilet paper or garbage bags or diapers. But without these products, it's pretty hard to get a job, keep an apartment, concentrate on the teacher's lesson, and participate in the community. But these products – which may account for up to a third of the average weekly grocery bill – aren't covered by food stamps, and they aren't usually included in other monetary aid formulas. They probably should be – but in the meantime, the Personal Essentials Pantry can help by providing families in need with these products – everything from toilet paper to laundry soap to dish soap to combs and brushes to nail clippers to dental floss to toothbrushes to body soap to skin lotion to anti-bacterial ointment to band aids to sanitary napkins to shampoo to baby rash ointment to diapers.
